Steps to Finding Reliable Information



- Step 1: Get ready to manage the information you find
- Step 2: Plan your search
- Step 3: What sort of information sources?
- Step 4: Look for books use Primo and ebook collections
- Step 5: Look for research level material, e.g. journal articles. Use the Find Databases option in Primo to identify relevant databases, then link and search
- Step 6: Look for support materials Use Google or other search engines
- Step 7: Keep track of your references, avoid plagiarism

In all processes: be aware of copyright and the need to avoid plagiarism




By signing in before you begin your search, you can easily access electronic resources, request or renew items and save searches and items to

Primo "discovery" tool – searches across multiple library sources + some databases

Primo search rules




- Your results depend on applying search rules correctly
 - * for different endings e.g. object* looks for object, objects, objectify, objective, objectives
 - "phrase search" e.g. "oil spill" looks for these exact words in this exact order
 - ocean* OR marine looks for either/any of these words (with different endings). Will give more results as alternative words are searched for
 - OR linking word must be in capital letters




Books+ tab: finds items that contain the search terms in title or description of books/theses held in our library




Primo: Refine your results



- Default sorted by Relevance. Can change this, e.g. by Date-newest
- Availability Available online (if you didn't use this radio button at the top)



Books: Details tab provides useful information if you are manually recording your references



General Note



Primo: Looking for books on a topic



- Sign in, use Advanced Search
- Use Books+ radio button, then Refine to Available online
 - OR use Online Access Materials, then Refine by Resource Type
- Be flexible with your keywords, e.g. use truncation, alternative words
- If too many results: limit to certain **Subject** areas
- If too few results: try broadening out your search terms, look for spelling errors, check your search rules
- Do not be disappointed if you do not find many items limitations imposed by the indexing in Primo. Extend your search to individual collections

Ebooks



- Primo search: results are often limited to the words which appear in the title or description
 - There's a time delay in adding these records to Primo

- Individual ebook collections: can search across the full-text content of ebooks
 - Can limit your search to your specialised search terms and keywords
 - Search rules vary across each collection
 - Download and viewing options vary across the collections (each supplier has their own rules)

- 6,000+ full text books published by Elsevier
- Presented in PDF chapters, can download as required

SpringerLink

- 70,000+ full texts books published by Springer
- Presented in PDF chapters, can download as required
- Can purchase print-on-demand copy for £24.99
- University Press Scholarship Online (UPSO)
 - 15,000 (UPSO) full text items from selected University publishers

Art & Architecture Complete (EBSCO)

Art & Architecture Complete is a bibliographic database that provides cover-to-cover indexing and abstracts for hundreds of academic journals, magazines and trade publications, many in full text. There are also hundreds of books, as well as selective coverage for additional publications, and an Image Collection of many thousands of images provided by Picture Desk and others. The subject coverage includes archaeology, architecture, history of architecture, history of design.

Cambridge Core

Journals: collection of full text journals published by Cambridge University Press (CUP). Books: we subscribe to a small selection of titles within the ebook collection. Subjects covered include the Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Science, Technology and Medicine. A Green tick followed by 'Access' in the record signifies that we have access to the full-text of the item.

Dawsonera

We have access to the full text of many ebooks through this provider, with thousands of other titles available for preview. All books are sourced from academic publishers and most subjects are covered.


Temporary Access to Additional E-Resources


Trial period access to additional content – this material is NOT indexed in Primo. Broad coverage for all subjects: suggest you check CUP, EBSCO, Gale, Kortext, ProQuest, SAGE and VitalSource
Subject-specific: Law, see GSW for Geology, Bloomsbury for Arts/Humanities



Books



- Good for overview reading
- Summarise information pulled from lots of different primary sources
- Use the citations/references provided in the Further Reading or References sections of chapters to read beyond a topic, or get more detail on a topic
- Use Primo, and the Additional Temporary Eresources, to find out what we hold or have access to



Action – get started



- Use Primo for broad searching of ebooks
- Use Primo > Find Databases to link through to individual ebook collections, e.g. Ebook Central, SpringerLink, ScienceDirect and UPSO to carry out much more detailed searches within ebooks
- Remember to look in our Temporary E-resources list as this content is not listed in Primo
 - VitalSource may be of particular use (currently available to end June)
