

Some other e-book collections

Information Skills Practical Workshop

Listed below are some other e-book collections you can access as members of the University of Aberdeen, along with the range of subjects covered by each of the collections. Each collection listed below will have different restrictions on printing/copying/downloading and each will have its own search rules, which can be found by locating the Help option within the collection.

To access the collections:

1. Go to Primo (<http://primo.abdn.ac.uk/>) and select the **Find Databases** tab near the top of the screen
2. Then on the left-hand side of the screen select: **All Ebook Collections**
3. You will then get a list below of the many e-book collections we subscribe to
4. Select the collection you are interested in. This opens the collection's details page in Primo. In the **View Online** section click the name of the collection. Primo will open it in a new tab

EEBO: Early English Books Online	http://eebo.chadwyck.com
From the first book printed in English by William Caxton, through the age of Spenser and Shakespeare, this incomparable collection now contains more than 100,000 titles. This collection covers many subject areas, including English literature, history, philosophy, linguistics, theology, music, fine arts, education, mathematics, and science.

This database provides access to about 22,000 titles and editions held in major repositories including the Danish Royal Library, the National Central Library in Florence, the National Library of France, and the National Library of the Netherlands. We have access to Collections 1-4, which include significant works by Aristotle, Copernicus, Descartes, Erasmus, Kepler, Luther and Spinoza, alongside ephemeral works such as pamphlets and almanacs. Subject areas include science, medicine, philosophy, theology, literature, history, political science, travel and exploration.	
ECCO: Eighteenth Century Collections Online	http://infotrac.galegroup.com/itweb/abdn
Eighteenth Century Collections Online is a comprehensive digital edition of The Eighteenth Century, the world's largest library of the printed book on microfilm. Over 180,000 titles and editions published between 1701 and 1800 are available. The database allows full-text searching of more than 33 million pages of material, in essence, every significant English-language and foreign-language title printed in the United Kingdom, along with thousands of important works from the Americas.	
IEEE Xplore	http://ieeexplore.ieee.org
While also providing full text access to IEEE's technical literature in electrical engineering, computer science, and electronics, this collection also includes access to all IEEE-Wiley e-books, totalling more than 700 titles.	
LION: Literature Online	http://literature.proquest.com
LION is a fully searchable library of more than 350,000 works of English language poetry, drama and prose, 390 full-text literature journals, and other key criticism and reference resources.

OECD iLibrary contains all the publications and datasets released by OECD (Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development), International Energy Agency, Nuclear Energy Agency, OECD Development Centre, PISA (Programme for International Student Assessment), and International Transport Forum (ITF). Subjects included in this resource are agriculture and food, development, economics, education and skills, emerging economies, employment, energy, environment and sustainable development, health, historical economic statistics, migration, national accounts, social issues, taxation and transport. Coverage is from 1998 to present and we have access to 11,000 titles. Please note that only 1,000 are listed on Primo.
